A New Song



Psalm 96 begins this way:

O sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth.

Sing a <u>new</u> song to God, the psalmist tells us – not the same old song one more time around. As old as the scriptures are, they are always about new beginnings and fresh starts. When the people of Israel couldn't get their side of the covenant with God right, generation after generation, God's response was "I will make a new covenant, ... and I will write it on their hearts" (Jeremiah 31). And Isaiah tells us that God says,

News from the Board of Missions

While we usually think of the Christmas season as ending December 25, liturgically that is when it starts. The 12 days of Christmas end on January 6 with Epiphany. Tradition holds that is when the magi arrived with their gifts for Jesus. So it is in January that we present our gifts for the UCC Christmas Fund, our Mission of the Month.

The Christmas Fund supports those who diligently worked for Christ's church and now have financial struggles. The grants fall into four categories:

1) Gifts to retired UCC clergy and lay employees with limited financial resources just to say "Thank You" for years of dedicated service.

2) Monthly pension supplements for those who labored in small struggling churches and never could accumulate sufficient funds for a comfortable retirement. These supplements bring household income up to a minimum level so recipients can afford basic necessities such as food, utilities and health care.

3) Assistance in paying necessary Medicare Supplemental Insurance premiums whose cost might otherwise be out of reach.

4) Emergency grants to active and retired clergy and lay employees with unforeseen circumstances that create financial hardship. These may include natural and human-made disasters, accidents, family crises and the like.

Giving to the UCC Christmas Fund is a way for each of us to say "Thank You" to the clergy and lay people who dedicated their lives to spreading the message of Christ that God loves us all and our task is to spread that love.

And remember, when you give to a MOM, you are controlling how your church distributes our Missions Trust Fund. The more you give, the more the church gives from the missions trust.

Thank you with all my heart for your friendship and for making me feel like part of your family.


